

**KILKENNY CITY COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING  
June 10, 2019**

There was a regular meeting of the Kilkenny City Council held in Council Chambers on June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

**Council in attendance:** Mayor Kevin Taaffe, Jr., Council Members Tammy Holicky, Terry Ferch, Cameron Hankins

1. **Call to Order.** Mayor Kevin Taaffe, Jr. called the meeting to order at 7 pm.
2. **Pledge of Allegiance.**
3. **Approval of Minutes:** Regular meeting held May 13, 2019. Motion by Tammy Holicky, seconded by Terry Ferch to approve the minutes as written. Unanimous vote. Motion carried.
4. **Approval of agenda.** After adding Dakota Anderson and Faith Barnett to Presentations, a motion was made by Cameron Hankins, seconded by Tammy Holicky to approve the agenda as ammended. Unanimous vote. Motion carried.
5. **Staff Announcements:** City-wide Cleanup is June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Flag retirement ceremony June 14<sup>th</sup> at Fire Hall.
6. **Presentations:**
  - A) **Sheriff Department:** not present
  - B) **PeopleService:** not present
  - C) **Donations:** Dakota Anderson and Faith Barnett donated \$55.00 of the money that they made selling lemonade and asked that it be used towards Park and Rec. They like the park and think it is important to the community. Council expressed their gratitude for the girls' gift and their desire to better the community.
7. **New Business:**
  - A) **Snow Ordinance:** Jason Moran will have a proposal for a snow ordinance for the next meeting.
  - B) **Livestock/Farm Animal Ordinance:** Section 1015 of the City Code Book. After a citizen complaint of being disturbed by a rooster crowing, the code book was consulted as to what we have in place that would apply. Section 1015 covers farm animals but Council felt it needed some adjusting. A proposed change in the wording will be presented at the next council meeting.
  - C) **County Road 55:** Kevin Taaffe had a conversation with Dave Tiegs, the County Engineer, about the City of Kilkenny taking over the maintenance of County 55. An agreement needs to be drafted and looked at at the next meeting.
  - D) **Blight:** Notices need to be sent out to the Robinson, and Miller properties for grass. We will wait until City-Wide Cleanup is done before sending out other blight notices.
8. **Unfinished Business:**
  - A) **Jaguar Communications:** Jaguar has received the info from the surveys and hope to have us on their schedule for a summer install.
  - B) **Waste Management Contract:** Waste Management has agreed to provide service for a city wide cleanup as we requested. They will be forwarding a new contract for signature with those terms so this issue is resolved.

- C) **Predatory Offender Ordinance:** A motion was made by Cameron Hankins and seconded by Terry Ferch to set a public hearing on July 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm to discuss the proposed Designated Predatory Offender Residency Restrictions. Unanimous vote. Motion passed.
- D) **Repairs to manhole, road by Fire Hall and Railroad Ave:** There was a discussion on what to do with the road repairs that need to be done by the fire hall and on Railroad Avenue. Kevin will contact local contractors to get a better idea about options and costs.
- E) **Well House:** Since the ceiling of the well house is concrete, and the building is old brick, the feeling is that the well house will need to be replaced, but the roof still needs a temporary fix until the permanent plan takes place.
- F) **Halfway to St. Paddy's Day:** Tom Little will be doing sound and lights for the entertainment. Food vendor positions are filled. We are looking for a sponsor for the rented stage. Kevin is talking to Vintage Escapes to possibly host the dinner for our guests for Halfway. Martin Brett should be joining us this year. Bob Busta found a tent at Menards that would work for the City booth. A motion was made by Kevin Taaffe, Jr., seconded by Tammy Holicky to approve an expenditure of up to \$250.00 towards the purchase of the tent with the side wall kit. Unanimous vote. Motion carried.
9. **Approval of Disbursements.** Motion by Tammy Holicky, seconded by Terry Ferch to approve the City's disbursements and June expenditures. Unanimous vote. Motion carried.
10. **Imprest Cash Fund:** The Imprest cash fund does not need to be paid back this month.
11. **Citizen Time:** A tree is down near the horseshoe pits. Jason Villwock talked to the council about a lawn mowing contract and possibly buying the city mower. The pallet business is becoming a hazard.
12. **Council Discussion:**
1. The Fogarty rental contract needs to be updated. Jason Moran will update for the next council meeting.
  2. Council Member Vacancy: Bob Busta expressed an interest in filling the vacant seat. A notice will be placed in the paper for interested parties to send a letter of interest and the position will be appointed at the next council meeting.
  3. Right of Way Permit for Jaguar: We will not be charging Jaguar for a right of way permit to bring the fiber optics cable into town, but we will request a plan including maps.
  4. Donation: A motion was made by Cameron Hankins, seconded by Terry Ferch to accept the donation of \$55.00 from Dakota Anderson and Faith Barnett. Unanimous vote. Motion carried. Jason Moran will draft the resolution to be accepted at the next council meeting.
  5. Tammy Holicky checked the park shed and found bases that were in good condition so we do not need to buy new ones at this time.
  6. Park Party: July 24<sup>th</sup> there will be a community Park Party starting at 5:30 with a hot dog meal, then a craft at the library, ending with a movie at the fire hall.
13. **Adjourn.** Motion by Cameron Hankins, seconded by Tammy Holicky to adjourn the meeting at 8:42 pm. Unanimous vote. Motion carried.
