

## CHAPTER 8. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

### Section 800 – EXHIBITION DRIVING

Subd. 1 Prima Facie Evidence. It is prima facie evidence of exhibition driving when a motor vehicle stops, starts, accelerates, decelerates or turns at an unnecessary rate of speed so as to cause tires to squeal, gears to grind, soil to be thrown, engine backfire, fishtailing or skidding, or so as to cause the front tire(s) to lose contact with the ground or roadway.

Subd 2. Unlawful Act. It is a misdemeanor for any person to do any exhibition driving on any street, parking lot, or other public or private property, except when an emergency creates necessity for such operation to prevent injury to persons or damage to property; provided that this Section shall not apply to driving on a racetrack. For purposes of this Section, a “racetrack” means any track or premises whereon motorized vehicles, horses, dogs or other animals or fowl legally compete in a race or timed contests for an audience, the members of which have directly or indirectly paid an consideration for admission.

## Section 801 – **Regulations for Snow Emergencies and Parking During the Same**

Subd. 801.01 **Declaration of Emergency.** During the event of an accumulation of two inches or more of snow, a snow emergency shall be deemed to exist in the City of Kilkenny.

Subd. 801.02 **Restrictions on Parking During Snow Emergency.** During the period of any snow emergency, the following restrictions on parking shall be in effect:

- (A) No vehicle shall be parked or left unattended on any portion of the public streets until the street has been fully cleared of snow to the curb.

Subd. 801.03 **Violation.** When any representative of the City's Police Department or designee finds a vehicle parked or left unattended upon a street in violation of this snow emergency subchapter, the officer is hereby authorized to require the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle to remove the vehicle to a position in compliance with this subchapter. When any police officer finds the vehicle parked or left unattended upon any street in violation of the snow emergency subchapter, the officer is hereby authorized to impound the unlawfully parked vehicle and provide for its removal. The officer may remove the vehicle to a convenient garage or other facility or place of safety in the officer's discretion. Any charge, fee, tow bill, storage cost, or other imposition placed against the vehicle for the cost of removal or storage shall be the expense of the owner of the vehicle and shall be paid prior to the vehicle being released from storage.

Violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of \$130 for the first offense, \$260 for the second offense, \$750 for the third offense, and \$1000 for the 4<sup>th</sup> offense as measured within a five-year time period.
